Lee Patterson:



Lee Patterson's earthy approach to his music has won him friends and admirers all over the world. His highly acclaimed 2004 debut release "Razum Frazum" saw him gain huge recognition throughout the folk and singer-songwriter community. However, it was when he became the first white person to receive a British Gospel Award (Birmingham 2004) for his song "Working on a Building" that music critics really started to become aware of his work.

Despite the growing interest in his music, Lee clung firmly to his beliefs that if you want something done well, you should do it yourself, refusing to sign up with a larger label. He released his second album "The Grinder's Monkey" in 2007 and began building a solid live following throughout the country with his solo live shows and supports with the likes of Chris Smither, James Yorkston, King Creosote, Dave Arcari and Jackie Leven.

Dave Arcari:



SLIDE guitarist & songwriter Dave Arcari's alt.blues sounds owe as much to trash country, punk and rockabilly as they do pre-war Delta blues and have been showcased via six internationally-acclaimed solo CD releases. His latest album -Devil's Left Hand - was released on Buzz Records on 1 November 2010. His new album will be released on French record label Dixiefrog in early 2012.

With more than 100 UK dates a year plus regular shows in Finland, Estonia, France, Germany, Belgium, Poland and Canada, Arcari is one of the hardest gigging live artists on the circuit. A series of shows with folks including Steve Earle, Alabama 3, Seasick Steve and Jon Spencer along with his relentless UK and European tour schedule have established Arcari as a formidable international solo performer who is fast building a media reputation as a 'hell-raising National guitar madman'.

Duncan McCrone:



Duncan McCrone has been playing on the Scottish traditional music scene since the age of 18 which, he reluctantly admits, was not exactly yesterday...From his early years with trad outfit Hot Toddy, through his twenties with folk-rock outfit Dapplegrim and stints as bass player and vocalist with a few rock and pop covers bands (he was young, and he needed the money), he spent the longest stint of his career - eighteen years, man and boy - with the much-loved Glasgow trad outfit The Clydesiders, until the band finally called in a day in 2000. Duncan, together with his long-term musical collaborator Cy Jack embarked on a new career as a singer-songwriter in 2001, putting together his 'Tron Band' to record a live CD album 'Just a Glasgow Boy' in February of that year. A studio album, 'All You Need to Know' followed in 2006, and his latest CD 'Colourblind' is released on Edinburgh's Circular Records label in February 2012. Duncan and Cy are very successful writers and producers of music for TV, radio and film, although their first love is, and will always be, songwriting for themselves and other artists.
